

Expro's Occupational Road Risk Policy



The Policy of Expro is to:

Reduce the risks we face or create when driving in the course of our work.

Ensure the control of risk, prevention of harm and compliance with legal and similar requirements are managed.

We will always plan to perform our driving and journey management with consideration of our own employees & dependents, our customers, contractors, shareholders and the wider public.

The requirements of the Group Occupational Road Risk Policy are to:

- Prevent harm to people or the environment as a result of our driving
- Define and communicate responsibility and accountability for driving activities
- Provide and maintain safe and healthy vehicles
- Provide and maintain safe and effective journey planning and comprehensive risk assessment of driving activities
- Practice safe, defensive driving techniques while on the road
- Pro-actively identify, eliminate or minimise unnecessary road travel
- Ensure our employees and contractors are provided with the necessary information, instruction, training and supervision to enable them to drive in a safe and effective manner
- Define measureable objectives and targets for vehicle and driving related performance
- Establish and maintain effective management controls
- Measure, monitor and communicate performance against objectives and targets
- Continuously improve our safety driving performance through the reduction of vehicle related incidents

The organization and arrangements for implementing this Policy within the Expro are detailed in the Vehicles and Driving Standard (INS-006545) and associated supporting documents.

Expro ensures that this policy is:

Communicated: By explaining it during the employees' initial induction programme and following any subsequent changes.

Implemented: By regularly auditing the Road Risk management arrangements.

Sustained: By conducting Management reviews to verify the continued effectiveness of the Policy.
